Kabler, with a whistle around his neck, was like an experienced Circus Master of Ceremonies who had thought of everything to entertain his guests in each tent.

A Mariachi Band played adjacent to the Red Carpet guests would traverse as volunteers greeted and handed out programs. Water bottles were everywhere to wash down the provided pastry and when the day concluded, a table laden with assorted candies awaited the attendees, all departing with smiling faces. The weather cooperated and, though cloudy, it was sunny inside each room as all were enlightened by the shared information.
