

rich history of America's executive mansion. He gave his audiences an insider's view of the 226-year history of The White House. The WHHA was founded by First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy in 1961. Since then, over 47 million people have toured

The White House. McLaurin's talk included fascinating information on the daily operations at The White House, including descriptions of the permanent furniture and art collection reclaimed over the years. Since 1981, a yearly White House Christmas fund raiser and gift sales have funded the costs of maintaining the interior rugs, drapes, china, official portraits, and new furniture purchases.

McLaurin, presented Rancho Mirage Library Director David Bryant a collection of the 2017 White House historical books

for the library's collection. Attendees had a sneak peak of the ornament that will be sold this year but were sworn to secrecy
